Renewi works with Rodepa Plastics and Sphere to launch an innovative and circular concept for plastic film

Leading waste-to-product company, Renewi plc (LSE: RWI) is working with plastic recycling specialist, Rodepa Plastics and bag manufacturer, Sphere to launch an innovative and circular concept for plastic film.

Renewi collects soft plastics, such as plastic film, from many of its customers. The collection of these plastics is often combined with paper and cardboard. Under the new concept, the plastic film will be collected in a fully circular bag which makes it easy to separate and transport plastics in an efficient way.

Renewi can make new, top-quality collection bags from the waste plastic collected. The bags will be recycled by Rodepa Plastics to create recyclate, which will then be used by Sphere to make new plastic bags. The circular concept eliminates the use of raw materials and results in significantly lower CO₂ emissions.

This fits well with Renewi's ambition to help customers meet their sustainability targets. Renewi has also set itself ambitious targets to improve its own sustainability in areas such as its recycling rate and carbon avoidance. Working with partners in the supply chain is helping Renewi to reach these targets.

Gijs Derks, Commercial Director for Renewi's Commercial Waste Netherlands Division said:

"Circular business practices don't need to be difficult. Often it is just a question of having a shared ambition, working together and getting on with things. Through this success, Renewi, Rodepa Plastics and Sphere are showing that we have a shared ambition to make the circular economy a reality."

Adriaan Pierik, Commercial Director of Sphere said:

"This is yet another project that fits in with our objectives perfectly. We started producing waste bags from recycled material at our manufacturing site in Hardenberg more than 40 years ago now. Even back then, we were working on a circular economy. It is good to see that many parties share the same thoughts and ambitions. After all, it is only if everyone in the chain works together that we will be able to make a success of sustainability."

"We have been recycling plastic waste for more than 10 years. Circular thinking is in our DNA. We turn one person's waste into the next person's raw material. Collaboration is an essential aspect of this. Our successful collaboration with Renewi and Sphere is also saving on CO₂ and is providing us with the drive to continue development."

Currently operating 24 hours a day and 7 days a week, the company produces around 1,000 tons of recyclate every week.
